Reason:- In the interests of highway safety and securing the site to comply with Policy BE1 of the Halton Unitary Development Plan. Two additional objections received:- congestion near Appleton Surgery is now worse; too much traffic particularly at school pick up and drop off times; illegal parking; dangerous to cross road at the bend at peak times; can't see cars entering or exiting the pharmacy car park; concern about obvious drug misusers that use the pharmacy; why is the pharmacy open if it does not have planning permission; the area already has enough pharmacies; using Beaconsfield Pharmacy is much better; Appleton Surgery should have a facility like Beaconsfield Pharmacy; application should be refused or hours reduced to prevent it opening early or late to reduce traffic issues and discourage its use by unfavourable characters; why was the S.106 not put in force; family and friends do not use the pharmacy for fear of running into clients needing methadone or needle-exchange service; should be in the town centre.
