1.0 PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

1.1 The purpose of this report is to seek the Board's view on drawing up a programme of training and development events for Board members.

It also undertakes an annual training event on the Annual Statement of Accounts. It is therefore suggested that the first two training and development events focus on 'Efficiency' and Risk Management. It is suggested that two separate training events are put on to cover both of those topics. It is suggested that the training events follow the following format:
 - 1 An outline of the Board's responsibilities in that area:
 - 2 An explanation as to how that is discharged;

- An outline of the current priorities and how they are being delivered.
- 3.3 If members are content with these suggestions then arrangements will be made to organise the events. Members' views are sought.
